About New Outlook

New Outlook has been providing services to visually impaired people for over 170 years. Starting out in 1846 as part of the Birmingham Royal Institute for the Blind (BRIB), we became a standalone housing association in 1997.

Since then, we have gone through several changes to become what we are today – a professional, reliable and committed provider that strives to promote personalised services to support independent living for people with sensory or specialist needs.

What is a Care Home?

Our care homes offer high quality accommodation, with 24 hour care and support, to adults with sensory impairments, acquired brain injury, learning disabilities and other specialist needs. All of our homes are registered and inspected by the Care Quality Commission (CQC).

Edenwood has ten en-suite, single bedrooms, communal space and a spacious, private garden. It strives to create a caring and family-like environment and residents are encouraged to bring their own bedroom furnishings and possessions to make it their own. In some cases pets are allowed.

Facilities include:

- Ten en-suite single bedrooms
- Optional private phone line
- Care call system for constant support within bedrooms

All areas are fully accessible for individuals with a visual impairment or physical disability. A variety of route recognition aids are situated around the scheme; with wide hallways and doorways, contrasting decor and flooring and guide rails.

The communal area and spacious grounds offer:

- Lounge
- Kitchen/dining area
- Spacious private garden
- Communal bathroom with hoist
- Lift at the front of the house and between floors

Care Partners

Edenwood residents are supported by our specialist team who work alongside them to put together a person centred support plan to ensure they can be as independent as possible.

Residents requiring care are considered 'care partners' and are encouraged to take control of their care with the help of care givers.

Social and community

Edgbaston is a suburban area of south-west Birmingham. Edenwood is close to shops, a post office, doctors surgery and social centres. There are excellent public transport networks within the local area and Birmingham City Centre.

When at home residents can participate in a range of activities organised by staff to encourage independence and social interaction. These are based on residents choice, but include coffee mornings, social events/parties, exercise sessions and workshops.


